





As the season drew to a close, our attention turned to remembering Chris Hattam, whom we lost in December 2020 in tragic circumstances. Chris was a legend at Club; to paraphrase Churchill: "Never was so much owed by so many to one man".

After a Covid-enforced absence the U10's Chris Hattam Cup was back on 30th April.

With 5 teams competing for the cup at the Football Club's main pitch. This was the first chance for the players to compete for some silverware as well as winners medals, runners-up medals and third placed.

The HKFC boys were up for the first match against Valley Fort and played excellently to the strategy we've built on all season. The discipline and organisation with the ball in hand was great to see, with first-phase play punching holes in the defence, followed by moving the ball wide into the space created. Everything we've worked on in creating space in attack. HKFC ran out winners 6 tries to nil in the first game. It was a strategy that the boys stuck to all day.

Next up was a close game between Sai Kung and DB Pirates with some

As we headed into game, places in the two finals were still all to play for. Sandy Bay and Sai Kung both knew they needed a win to get them close to the main final. It was Sai Kung that would run out the eventual winners with 4 tries to nil, seeing them in the best place

The tries came and HKFC ran out 4-0 winners, with the whole squad playing their roles exceptionally well. Another clean sheet to mean not one try was given up all day. Sai Kung were well worthy of their place in the final and deserved runners-up.

The presentation of the medals and trophy was a great affair with speeches from **Rowan Varty** amongst others, a message from Chris' widow **Helen Hattam** for the teams, as well as a live stream of it sent to Helen.

With a minute to go, moving the ball using the full width of the field, HKFC white dotted down in the corner to beat the whistle and finish the final

4-4. The cup was duly shared between the HKFC teams in a fitting end to a fantastic morning's rugby which saw all teams perform well and play with real sportsmanship and camaraderie.

A great day of rugby which finished with speeches from **Dave Stanton**, **Paul Skurr** and **Lindsay Varty**, a former student of Chris who went on to play 15s rugby with Hong Kong for over 10 years and in 2017, competed at the 2017 Women's Rugby World Cup in Ireland. It has been at least 7 years since HKFC won the D1 title and that is the latest record HK Squash have of the leagues. 

With its own unique make-up and identity, its own sponsorship (**The Prudential**), its own special place in the local Community via exhibition matches at the HKFC Citi Soccer Sevens and Operation Santa Claus and its own unique name, the HKFC Crusaders are a proud addition to the fabric and tradition of the Club

ordination, agility and social interaction and most of all friendship, coupled with other social areas, and the beauty of the programme is... that it is open to Club members and non-members, thus making it a true Community initiative.

Nigel R Merritt, whilst coaching in the Junior and Youth Soccer programme at the Club one evening 18+ years ago, watched one of the ad hoc sessions and not only did the session have a fundamental and long-lasting effect on him, he could see the potential of the programme and its importance to the Soccer Section and the Club. Working with other Junior Soccer Coaches at the time (plus various non-Club member volunteers), the HKFC Crusaders was developed into the Community programme that it is today and integrated it into the Soccer Section. No one is turned away, regardless of age or sex, ability or nationality and most of all... the programme is free to all.

As the programme started to grow, so did the requirements - pitch space, coaching requirements, sponsorship, adoption into the Soccer Section and... most importantly... an identity. 




