
KIT DONATION SORTING DAY



Q&A WITH OLGA VOROTNIKOVA

1. Congratulations on being recognised as the Most Improved Player! Can you share what this journey has been like for you, moving from the B team all the way to A+?*

started playing tennis, I never imagined I would compete so much. Over the last two years, since joining the football club's tennis society, I've played in many teams, starting from the lowest level. To become good at something, you need to start from the bottom. Tennis is like life: if you want to be a general, you must first be a soldier; if you aspire to be the boss of a large company, you need to start

as a clerk. Each period of my journey has taught me valuable lessons. I've learned to adapt to different types of players – like the slower ones or the "lobsters" who hit moon balls. A good player must

know how to handle various situations.

and to have these opportunities. Ultimately, it all depends on your willingness. I wanted to become a better version of myself as a player and teammate, and I'm still working on many aspects as my journey continues."

2. What were some of the biggest challenges you faced while transitioning through the different levels, and how did you overcome them?

"The biggest challenge has been myself. Tennis is a very mental sport, and anger and frustration can be constant companions. I often found myself upset, especially in the beginning when I was playing at a lower level. However, I now realise that without that experience, I wouldn't have improved. I used to get easily frustrated by bad calls or outside interactions, but the only way to handle those feelings was to play better tennis. I focused on improving my technique, observing and educating myself. As I got better, those external factors became less impactful. I still have a lot to work on, and I have high hopes for playing in the highest division to continue my growth."

3. How has playing in higher divisions, especially in A+, helped you grow as a player both technically and mentally?

"Playing in A+ several times as a guest player has been a fantastic experience. Competing at a higher level is the best gift a tennis player can receive. Being surrounded by skilled players has motivated me to improve even more. I watched them closely, trying to replicate their shots and attitudes. I still have much to work on, but having the right partner and a smart captain has been invaluable. I am learning from the best."


4. Were there any specific moments, matches or turning points in your journey where you felt your game reached a new level?

"In doubles, having the right partner is crucial. I was fortunate to have the perfect partner in my team, which boosted my confidence. Winning more matches has made me happier and improved my game. I still remember our last final match of which my partner is **Portia Chan**; it was a deciding game with a lot of responsibility, but we felt confident. The experience we accumulated throughout the season really helped us perform at that critical moment."

5. What advice would you give to other players who are aspiring to improve and make similar leaps within their tennis careers?

"I would advise them to observe and not be afraid to try new things. Stay open to feedback and criticism, especially from those you consider better than you. Respect your opponents even when it's challenging. Always remember that the only way to replace frustration or disappointment is to play better tennis. Focus on improving your technique and skills by winning points with beautiful shots."





FIVE-TIME WORLD CHAMPION AND HONORARY MEMBER OF HKFC GEOFF HUNT

During December's WSF World Squash Team Championships, our squash committee secretary Ken Lo sat down for a discussion with these true legends of squash.

HERE ARE SOME OF THE LESSONS THEY SHARED

Geoff Hunt on fostering a love for the game:

Geoff Hunt: "The number one thing that you try to develop with people is to get them to enjoy playing the game - you must put them in an environment that produces that enjoyment."

Geoff Hunt: "I didn't start until I was 11, but I had a grounding in other sports. I don't believe you should just focus on one sport alone at school...

When I went to Qatar to coach, we had a situation where the young kids were almost forced into just doing squash. I had a young boy in the

programme who was a good footballer and he wanted to play football as well, so I said 'no he wants to play football a couple of days a week.'

So, he played football twice a week and ended up being the best player in Qatar and eventually he got the number 15 in the world because he had the skill from the other sports. It kept his interest: he was enjoying playing both sports."

Sarah on getting an education alongside training:

Sarah: "I joined the Australian Institute of Sport under **Jeff**, and I remember him sitting me down and saying you need to do school. And I fought him, but he convinced me that school was the right way to go because if something had gone wrong in squash, at least I'd finished my schooling and I had a good stepping stone to whatever would come after that. I'm pleased I did finish my school."

And how the decision comes from the child:

Sarah: "I remember as a kid my mum asked me 'do you want to play'. Then about a year later she said, 'do you still want to play', and I said yes, so she kept asking me so that the decisions came from me.

That commitment was the only thing my mum enforced on me. If the decisions are coming from the kid, it's easier to get them through rather than mum and dad sending them off all the time because it's what mum and dad want... just let the kid be in the driving seat and then they fall in love with the game."

FIVE-TIME WORLD CHAMPION AND HONORARY MEMBER OF HKFC SARAH FITZ-GERALD

Dick Lau on trying different sports:

Dick Lau: "If we want to help a kid build the passion, it takes time. If you really want to have a good result in two or three years, let kids try more sports like squash, tennis, badminton, whatever they like to do. Then every time when they come to play squash, let them enjoy it and then as long as they really enjoy it, they will keep doing it by themselves. When they reach 14 or 15, then maybe it's time for them to do more training."

And learning by watching others play:

Dick Lau: "I always encourage parents and the kids: watch top players play each shot – learn how to do a good forehand, a good drop shot, a good boast – learn from that and then one by one when they add together."

FORMER HONG KONG NUMBER ONE AND

Nick Matthew on the power of a sports psychologist:

Nick Matthew: "I've seen so many people turned around by developing the right mental approach... it's the gym for your mind. We would always go to a physical coach, and why would you not go to a mental coach... now there's a definite mindset that we go because we want to strive for improvement and so it's equally important as good technique."

Geoff agreed: "In my first year of coaching at a new institution, I put the sport psychologist as the last person that I had to call upon... after 12 months in the job, I had him first because I found everyone had a different approach and different way

of thinking, and I thought the sports psychologists added an enormous amount of help in helping people learn how to focus, how to be in control and how to implement their game plans."

Geoff on what matters most:

Geoff: I got a lot of my enjoyment out of playing squash by playing for a local club, so there's no reason why if you're not going to make the grade as a you know a top player, play for your local club!

The biggest thing I missed when I turned professional touring overseas is that I couldn't play for my beloved Elanora Club. We had such a good rapport and team spirit amongst our group built out over a number of years, and it was unbelievable really."

And there's nowhere better to do that than at the football club!







or those less familiar with Squash 57 (previously known as racketball) – it's played on a squash court, either singles or doubles, and the racket is shorter and heavier with a wider head compared to a squash racket. The name is derived from the diameter of the soft bouncy ball which is 57mm compared to that of a squash ball 40mm. The sport has gained popularity over the years as players experience less impact on the body as the ball does most of the work, experiencing longer rallies while still getting the workout in.

We had 17 players register for the inaugural Squash 57 Club Championships across the Men's Open and the Women's Open categories, playing a monrad and round robin format. On paper, we had a couple of interesting matchups with differing combination of Squash 57 experience and

squash levels. The top 4 seeds in the Men's Open category featured 4 players from Division 2 squash with **Wilson Chan** and **Mark Low** seeded 1st and 2nd respectively, both of whom have some Squash 57 experience. **Phil Head**, who has the most experience in Squash 57, seeded 5th.

In the Women's Open Category, **Carmen Lee** led the seedings as the favourite to win. For most of the players, it was their first time playing Squash 57 and causing chaos, but they soon got the hang of the strategy by not overhitting the ball and instead looking for the deep corners with more sliced shots, letting the ball do the work.

In the quarter-finals, we were treated with some fantastic Squash 57 as Phil Head narrowly took the win against 4th seed **Andrew Ward**, coming back from 7-10 down in the deciding game whilst

Rishad Schaefer took down Section Chair **Vincent Yu**, with Rishad slightly more experienced at the game.

For the finals, **Carmen Lee** comfortably managed her match against **Jennifer Chiu**, winning 11-7, 11-6, taking the Women's Open Squash 57 Championships. Meanwhile in the Men's category, **Mark Low** upstaged top seed **Wilson Chan** with great display of control in an exhibition of how Squash 57 is meant to be played, taking the match 11-2, 11-6, 11-2.

It was a great introduction to competitive Squash 57 at the Club with Hong Kong Squash committed to promote the discipline to the wider community of Hong Kong, with Squash 57 growing in popularity amongst quite a few countries like England and Malaysia.




