

In the summer months there is usually little to report on sport, and this has been exacerbated by Covid. However, there are two matters worthy of mention.

Sean was an active member of the Downs Syndrome community in Hong Kong and regarded the Club as a second home being an active participant and supporter of both Soccer and Rugby. He was a founder member of HKFC Crusaders soccer team which was set up in the early 2000's and this was a big part of his life at the Club. He led his team mates by example. As time passed Sean became somewhat of a "celebrity" at the Club and was an inspiration to many of us with his happy demeanour and big smile. A celebration of Sean's life was held in the Sportsman's Bar on Wednesday 30th June. Our condolences go to Sean's family.

Last, and by no means least I recently attended a Staff event where I was very pleased to be able to present Staff members with their **Yearly Star Awards**. Many congratulations are in order to **Patrick**, **Sandy** and **Calvin**. At the same time we were also able to present a number of **Long Service Staff Awards**. Again, many congratulations are in order to all recipients and , in particular to **Debby Chan** who has completed 30 years of service to the Club.

With the 2019/20 season having been postponed and subsequently cancelled around the mid-way point due to COVID-19, HKFC First Team manager Tony Hamilton-Bram made the most of the time off and recruited well on and off the field. The team welcomed Danny Beattie to the coaching team along with several soon-to-be very important players. As the squad prepared for the 2020/21 season, COVID continued to get in the way as pitches in Hong Kong were closed countless times. Tony and Danny ensured the squad remained focused by arranging weekly team hikes and Strength and Conditioning sessions (all socially distanced) as well as the regular usual training nights. The build up was complete and the squad were excited as the league was set to finally commence in November, but HKFC weren't to be so lucky! Their first game was postponed due to the request of the opponents, before the next opponents forfeited the game in advance with the HKFC being awarded a 3-0 victory without kicking a ball! The team were beginning to think they would never play again as the following week the pitches closed again due to another outbreak.

he pitches finally reopened again at the end of February and the squad were able to complete their fourth, maybe fifth, but final pre-season. Having been unbeaten in all friendlies, the team came into the league opener on the 28th February full of confidence. A routine 3-0 victory set the team up strongly and they went on to win the first 5 games scoring 19 goals without reply. The end of April moving into May would prove to be much tougher and the team were forced to dig out some results, winning 3 games in a row by only 1 goal. In the last of those 3, and the 8th game of the season, the team conceded their first goal of the campaign, from a well struck free kick.





The game would then finish 9-0, the biggest win of the season, and HKFC were confirmed champions of the HKFA First Division!

Although jubilant about the achievement, Tony and Danny reminded the squad that only half of the job was completed and the aim was now set to finish the season by winning every game. With a comfortable 3-0 victory in the second from last game, this didn't seem an issue, but the final game of the season would prove a struggle. After taking an early lead in the game, HKFC found themselves trailing 2-1 and then 3-2. After equalising 7 minutes from time, HKFC got the well-deserved winning goal in the 93rd minute and final kick of the game. The celebrations were outstanding and a great way for the team to end the season.

Although this year was a shortened season, everyone involved with the First Team, staff and players, deserve huge credit for the achievement of winning 13 games from 13.

Congratulations to the joint top goal scorers, Jean Maciel and Antoine Sahaghian who both finished on 7 goals for the season. Finally, a special mention must go to the very impressive performances week in week out by all defenders and both goalkeepers, which saw the team only concede 1 goal in 12 games, and none from open play (let's not talk about the 13th game!).

The squad would like to say a massive thank you to Tony and Danny for their relentless enthusiasm, commitment, will to win, and overall hard work put into this season as they set the high standards every week which have allowed the team to enjoy the success they've had. An additional thank you and well done must go to Anthony and his medical team who have worked hard at ensuring everyone is fit and ready each week, along with dealing with the moans and groans from the softies.

MINI RUGBY

2020/21 season sees a new marker for Hong Kong's mini rugby calendar. Recognised alongside the U12 Richard Hawkes Trophy, the U10 Chris Hattam Trophy includes round robin competitions before knock-out games. First played on May 2, 2021, Club U10s managed to land the win – forever engraved as inaugural winners on the silverware.



ne of the bleakest moments of the 2020/21 season was losing our mate, fellow coach, mentor, the wonderful **Chris Hattam**. Chris was a long-standing rugby coach and teacher at KGV in Kowloon, and passed away far, far, too early in December 2020. Chris coached for many seasons and had fingerprints over pretty much everything mini rugby, including U10s as his last full coaching season.

Thanks to Club chair **Denis Brock** for clearing extra Happy Valley pitch space, allowing space for a tournament of one hundred players, involving twelve U10 teams from Valley, Sandy Bay and Club, and 28 top games of mini rugby.

To ensure meaningful and close games, two pools were played. Five teams entered Pool A and competed for the U10 Chris Hattam Trophy itself, including two teams from Valley, one from Sandy Bay and two from Club: HKFC1 (Tigers), coached by **James Wood** and HKFC2

(Lions), coached by James Mendes.

Seven teams entered Pool B: three Valley teams, one from Sandy Bay and three from Club: HKFC3 (Jaguars), coached by Russell Coleman; HKFC4 (Pumas), coached by U10 Head Coach Alexander Davey and HKFC 5 (Cheetahs), coached by Vinay Sirininvas.

THE U10 FINAL

HKFC1 started undefeated in their pool. Following a very close semi-final the team made it through to the final against Valley, playing in front of nervous but expectant crowds. While the pool games showcased exciting and expansive attacking play (including skilful off-loads, wider passing, moving the ball into space), the final saw a return to "Route 1 Finals rugby": hard-running, pick-and-go, strong defence. Club players were simply magnificent and showed great character – contesting every tackle and breakdown and simply refusing to allow Valley to score. A late

short-range surge from **Thomas Wood** edged the trophy win.

While the win reflected efforts from our 60+ players over the season, well done to all who represented HKFC1 on the final: Ollie Howarth and Paddy Metson for their speed and attack agility, Thomas Wood and Simon Ferreira Danjoux for playing "powerhouse" roles, Gus Grewcock and Andre Chan for solid hit ups and defence, and Genraku and Taraku Kinoshita, our hugely talented "double trouble" twins, for their aggression, speed around the pitch and unflinching will to win. Well played to them all.

Special mention to **Iola Cairns** for her contributions to HKFC1, one of two remaining U10 girls still playing mixed rugby (the other is her great friend, **Naomi Chan**). Iola's thundering tackles during the final were central to Club defence. Iola capped her final session

The Pumas heard some stern words from coaches after this game.

The second game against Sandy Bay was a joy. Crunching tackles and clear outs defined the game from Ethan Tam, Milton Kwan, Tomas La Fontaine (again) and Rajvir Dillon. This allowed Paul De Charnace, Luke Holden and Kai Cochran plenty of running space. Tomek Davey underlined the win with an outstanding long range rumble from forty metres out to score his first try for HKFC. One draw, one loss, and one great win.

In the final game against Valley, the Pumas gave their all. Luke Holden ran in more long range tries. Kai Cochran weaved a fabulous try through the Valley defence. But the strong running from Valley team kept coming, and even though Luke Kaminski, Tomas La Fontaine and Tomek Davey tackled from all angles in defence, pressure allowed Valley a 3-2 lead. Closing seconds saw peak commitment from the Pumas. Milton Kwan swatted away defenders like flies, Jackson Whittaker rampaged forward, offloads reached Kai who nearly scored - only to be driven back on the line. The Pumas attacked to the final hooter but, alas, Valley held on for the win.

A huge thanks to all the Pumas coaches and to the fabulous parents who have supported throughout the season and cheered every play like a World Cup final.

On attack, the team was led by Ellen Loo, who was the best ball carrier of the day, breaking tackles, and making ground. Assisting on attack was Amber Bourne, who worked hard to make ground and made good breaks into space. The offensive champion was Danielle Leung whose pace and sidestepping made her unstoppable in scoring 5 tries for the day. In support were Amy Yu, who

ran the length of the pitch to take the offload and score a try, and Maleha Jastreboff on the wing who had some good breaks and worked hard to defend her touch line. 


ALAN RUSSELL POWRIE

I first met Alan on the PHAD's South East Asia tour in 1985. On the Bangkok leg, some of us were told we had to share hotel rooms and the Tour Leader paired me with Slotter, as he was uniformly known. "But don't worry" said the TL, "you will never see him". Alan was notorious on tour for meeting up with clients and business associates and sure enough, our paths rarely crossed. The following year we went to Kenya and, mirabile dictu, Alan did not have any clients in Nairobi so he was made TL. Having lost two tourists in Dubai, owing to visa issues, his crowning moment was presiding over a busload of anxious PHADs surveying our broken down bus somewhere on the road to Mombasa. His imperturbability and sang-froid remain an abiding memory to this day.

Alan was a man never easily fazed. A highly competent accountant, he was made a partner of Deloitte at an early age and had a very successful career at a time when Hong Kong was establishing itself as a major financial centre. Over late night drinks in the Chinnery Bar, he claimed to have been involved in more IPOs in the last 12 months than

any other accountant in Hong Kong. I naturally demurred at this preposterous suggestion and bets were exchanged. As I signed the bill in the Mandarin Grill a month or so later, I realised Alan did need to be believed occasionally.

Alan was a great controversialist. He would argue anything with anyone. I remember several PHADs tourists being driven to distracted submission by Alan's relentless onslaughts. But in truth, there was always a twinkle in the eye, a smirk to others listening to the argument and, unusually for a true Scotsman, an ever-present willingness




to buy his defeated opponent a consolatory beer.

Alan and I played hockey together for many years, ending our vintage wine days in the H Team. A solid defensive half or back and a reliable and committed player, I always knew he was there to take the square pass and do something sensible with the ball. Retired in Hong Kong, he enjoyed hiking and was a regular feature in the Sportsman's Bar. Felled by an incurable disease, he left us too young and too soon. But he will always be fondly remembered.



ATHLETE OF THE MONTH

ROBYN CHARTER

This month we would like to highlight one of the HKFC Swimming and Triathlon VIPs Robyn Charter. Robyn is a former South African National level swimmer who competed at the highest levels of the sport. Born and raised on a farm in South Africa, she was constantly surrounded by water. She had always taken part in swim meets throughout primary school; however it was only in year 10 (2010) when she started competing on a National level where she quickly rose to the top! From 2010-2012, she placed top 3 at South African nationals and placed 4th in the 50 back at the South African Olympic trials in 2012. While competing at the national level for swimming, Robyn also represented her province in the SA National Water Polo Championship from 2008-2012.

Robyn is an unbelievable athlete all around. In addition to competing for the



Swimming and Triathlon Society, Robyn also plays netball for the HKFC and is either cycling or running when not on the court or in the pool. Since joining the Swimming and Triathlon society in 2019, Robyn has been a top performer and currently holds 2 HK Masters records. She grabbed her first record in the 200 IM and just recently broke the 50M backstroke record. In addition to swimming, she is also a fierce triathlon competitor and has placed 2nd in 2 international events prior to Covid -World Discovery Triathlon age Group Category and Laguna Phuket Triathlon Olympic Distance Solo Category.







STAYIN ALIVE

In March 1946 there was no Hong Kong Football Club. All that was left of it was a plot of land with a ruin that once was a clubhouse. and an ex-potato patch infested with chips of granite that used to be a football pitch / bowling green - all of it coveted by the **British Military Administration** which was writing up a requisition order. That the HKFC survived after World War II had a lot to do with one man, a wiry piece of work hardened by 29 years of personal and global tragedy. When it came to survival, Ken Forrow was a past-master.

Life made no secret from the start that it was going to be hard; his mother was sixteen when she brought him into the world in London in the midst of the Great War. By the age of fifteen Kenneth William Forrow had lost a father, gained a stepfather called H.C. Pratt who was posted to Hong Kong as a prison warder, and was earning his keep as a newspaper 'assistant' with the Hong-

kong Telegraph in Wyndham Street. Staying alive was not the only skill young Ken developed. He learned as a boy on the soccer pitch that defensiveness was the secret to longevity. By season 1934-35, aged 18, he was a clerk in the GPO and a regular in the HKFC 2nd XI when not filling in as goalkeeper for the seniors. Long limbs and lightning reflexes made up for the shadow he failed to cast. In October 1935 he performed the grown-up task of giving away his sister at St Andrew's Church. The best man was George Hill, vice-captain (1935-36) then captain (1936-37) of the HKFC 1st XI, responsibilities which Forrow himself took on over the next two seasons.

A MAN IN CLUB BOOTS

On Saturday, 7th March 1936 he again proved himself a man, this time wearing Club boots. He was assigned the task of marking Lee Wai-tong, South China's superstar striker. Lee, eleven years Forrow's senior, would in five months be leading China's first national soccer squad at the Berlin Olympics. South China were regular 1st Division champs; Club were mid-ladder and playing away.

For an entire 'exhilarating' match Forrow starved Lee of the ball. Club won 5-0. At the age of 21, 'K.W. Forrow' appeared in 1938 directories as an 'examiner' with the Government Audit Office. That year he lost more family – his sister to smallpox and his stepfather to heart failure. Again his mother married, this time to Arthur Bailey, a quartermaster sergeant in the Royal Army Service Corps. At the call for able-bodied expatriates to sign up with the Hong Kong Volunteer Defence Corps, Forrow chose to be a cadet pilot with the Volunteer Air Arm, such as it was: "Three obsolete torpedo-bombers and two amphibians," he would recall. The Japanese made short work of them when they invaded on Monday, 8 December 1941.

Pte. Forrow made it to Kai Tak Airfield in er the would-be airman found himself attached to a Volunteer infantry unit, manning a Vickers machine-gun 'tied on top of a carrier and totally exposed to fire' as it patrolled the road around Tai Tam 'rolling Mills bombs down the hillside' it in to a 'relief force' and dispatched on the gun-carrier to rescue civilians from the Repulse Bay Hotel, he could only cringe as it 'drove up to (the) front door,' again 'in full sight of the enemy.' This time he got away via a tunnel to the beach, became trapped on a hillside next to a cemetery, and spent Christmas Eve passed out from exhaustion among companions he did not recognise in the captured and put into Shamshuipo PoW camp, as was Arthur Bailey. Hard times continued for his mother, too. She was interned in Stanley.

THE CLUB HISTORY

LOOKING FOR MORE

Shipped to Japan in January 1943 as a slave labourer, in April 1945 he was - target four months later for the atom bomb dropped by the Enola Gay. Forrow survived it all, and came up looking for more. After six months rehabilitation in Australia he landed back in Hong Kong as a Government accountant, and headed straight for The only bright spot on the landscape had used the Club House as a stable, the pitch and green as a place to chip blocks of granite into a memorial to themselves. Forrow had to pull a team together, smartly, to rebuild the Club and forestall requisition of the grounds for their own recreational purposes by the British Army. He sought out Arthur Morse, HSBC chief and Hong Kong Football Association president. Morse rolled up his sleeves, took control of the politics that ensued, and was elected AGM on 22th July 1946 attended by 29 members at the Gloucester Hotel.

By then Ken Forrow, as Club Secretary, had been working for weeks in the summer heat on the HKFC grounds side-by-side with Smiler and a 'gang of female coolies.' The pitch had been cleared of granite chips, picked up one-by-one and deposited in rows of holes six feet deep. It had been resurfaced with turf purloined from the abandoned CCC and Police cricket grounds next door, 'levelled and wired off.' The Club House was 'in a reasonable state of repair,' and relaying of the bowling green had begun. Forrow, as Soccer Captain, also had the task of finding ten other players

so the Club could enter an XI in the rehabilitated League for season 1946-47. He recruited half a dozen pre-war teammates as a nucleus, but by the time the Club pitch was ready for training on 1 August it was clear that fielding a competitive side was a pipe dream.

IMMEASURABLE DEBT

On 26 September 1946, the Club grounds were re-opened by President Morse. By year's end over 60 new members had been signed up and the bar profits had turned 'healthy.' Club glory on the field was history. In 1946-47 the 'A' XI was twelfth of twelve teams in 1st Division, the junior XI sat at the bottom of an eighteen-team ladder in 2nd Division. On the last weekend of August 1947, bowling returned to the HKFC green; Ken Forrow was Club's only winning skip of five rinks versus 'Taikoo and the Prison Officers' Club.' At soccer, Roboostoff. Hong Kong won 5-1. Aged XI skipper for 1951-52, prompting a

respectful lament. "(Club Soccer) requires new faces badly," groaned Chairman Jack Skinner. "We cannot rely forever on old stalwarts!"

Forrow was himself elected Club Chairman in 1955. An all-concrete four-stand stadium had just been built, complete with floodlighting, the HKFC was deeply in debt to HSBC and the first repayment of the Government's \$550,000 loan had been missed. Life matter what shoes he was wearing. on surviving. He was Chairman for five terms, his last ending in 1961. He is in the Treasury at the time as a 'hard had brushed with death, as often as Ken Forrow deserved to be cut a little slack. He retired to England in 1972, leaving behind a Football Club he had served through his entire adult life, and which by then was in control of its debts - all of its debts, save the incalculable one it still owes him.
