April gets off to a flying start... straight out of the Easter break we head into **Rugby Week**, with one of our key signature sports events, the **Tradition HKFC Rugby 10s**. Widely regarded as the "World's Best 10s" tournament, and with the continued growth of the women's game, it promises to deliver yet another fantastic two days of rugby action in the Club.

Hot on the heels of the 10s, the **Hong Kong Sevens** hosts it's final Hong Kong Island spectacular before the tournament moves across the harbour to the new stadium at Kai Tak Sports Park. We anticipate there will be a special buzz around the Club, across Causeway Bay and Happy Valley all week. Be sure to note all the special changes to facility operations and F&B outlet offerings. We also highly recommend taking taxis or public transport to and from the Club to avoid long waits for car parks.

It's also the Sport of Soccer that shines. Last March 6th, I was down on the Club's main pitch to announce Standard Chartered Priority Private as the new title sponsor of the **HKFC Standard Chartered Soccer Sevens**. This prestigious partnership heralds a new chapter for the event, which is set to celebrate its 25th year and will further captivate fans at the Hong Kong Football Club from 24 to 26 May 2024 with the addition of a Women's Tournament for the first time.

The HKFC Soccer Sevens has been a highlight on the Hong Kong football calendar since its inception in 1999 and the 2024 edition promises to deliver unparalleled excitement and competition. Twenty-six teams will be split between the Main Event and the Masters Tournament while an eight team Women's Tournament will also be introduced. With 16 teams vying for the title in the Main Event, including 10 overseas-based clubs making the journey to Hong Kong, this year's competition is poised to be among the most fiercely contested yet.

But in the meantime, there are 2 **Hong Kong Soccer Premier League home matches** for our HKFC 1st Team to win. First on the 14th vs. Lee Man and then on the 28th vs. Tai Po. We need you to gather all your friends and family, fill the stands and cheer them onto victory.

Finally, we are planning the first ever **HKFC Annual Sports Gala Dinner** on **Saturday, 7th September**. There will be announcements coming out as we prepare for all the details of the event, but this is the first opportunity for you to Save the Date!

緊接港會十人賽而來的是最後一年在港島舉行的 香港國際七人欖球賽,其後賽事將移師至維港另一邊的啟德體育園新球場。因此,今年的國際七欖別具意義,估計從本會上下到銅鑼灣及跑馬地,整個星期將會是一片熱鬧的景象。緊記留意設施開放時間及餐飲服務的特別變動,我們也強烈建議乘搭的士或公共交通工具前往及離開本會,以免花長時間等侯停車場泊位。

除了欖球,足球同樣是本月的焦點。本人3月6日在主球場宣布渣打優先私人理財成為港會渣打七人足球賽的新冠名贊助。這個享有盛譽的贊助夥伴為慶祝25周年的七人賽揭開新一章,而且七人賽更首度增設女子錦標賽,將會令5月24日至26日匯聚在香港足球會的球迷看得更加入迷。

港會七人足球賽自1999年成立以來,一直都是香港足球賽程中的精彩一環,而2024年的比賽保證帶給大家前所未有的刺激及較量。26支球隊將分別出戰主賽事及名人賽,有8支球隊參加的女子賽亦將首次登場。今屆共有16支球隊爭奪主賽事的冠軍,其中包括10支遠道而來的海外勁旅,因此七人賽勢必成為目前競逐最激烈的賽事。

不過留意七人賽之外,與此同時可以支持一下我們的足球隊一隊,球隊今個月也要贏得兩場**香港超級聯賽主場賽事**,14日先對理文,然後28日再對大埔。在此呼籲大家召集所有親朋戚友坐滿看台,一同為球隊打氣至勝利一刻。

最後,我們正籌劃於9月7日(星期六)舉行首個港會年度體育晚宴,在準備活動細節時,亦會陸續有更多公告,請大家為這盛會先預留這個大日子!



Craig Nortje continued his excellent form from 2023 with a clean sweep of gold medals in 50m Freestyle, 50m Butterfly and 25m Freestyle. Backed up by teammates Edmund Wan (silver 25m Freestyle and bronze, 50m Freestyle), Wing Ka Wu (gold, 50m Butterfly), Lik Sun Fong (gold, 200m Freestyle), Chris Cheng (silver, 50m Butterfly), Patrick Ip (3rd, 200m Freestyle) and Shek Pui Lo (5th, 50m Butterfly and 50m Freestyle). In a highly competitive 4 x 25m relay team, the men's team finished 5th - with less than one second separating 3rd, 4th and 5th place.

Leading the ladies in a fine display of swimming was the evergreen Farah Master, winning gold, silver and bronze medals in the 50m Breaststroke, 25m Backstroke and 200m Butterfly respectively. **Lou-Salmone Chou** also had a great swim to finish 2nd, 25m

Backstroke. The ladies were joined by Christina and Janet for the $4 \times 25m$ relay and just narrowly missed out on gold but as this is the first time these ladies raced together, they will no doubt contend for the top spot on the next occasion.


















Remarkable achievements in HKLBA Winter Finals day on the 18th February 2024 are listed as follows.




Afterwards, the great camaraderie across both clubs was on full show as




