

It's been a busy summer here at the Club while a lot of our members were away for their summer vacations. I hope you all travelled, explored, relaxed with friends and family, back to familiar hometowns or into brave new frontiers. In the meantime, here's what you may have missed.

Our Food & Beverage Division focused on the rollout of the **new Sportsman's Bar menu** in phases. It is now up to the full and final menu count of over 90+ dishes, which is three times as many dishes before the renovation. We moved the **grand opening party** from 16th to **30th August** so that more members would be in town to join. What a blast! Now we're ready to launch the BBQ stations at the back deck. While some of the long lead equipment is on the way, Kenny and Chef Kit's teams will have pop-up BBQ stations and packages ready for you to take your entertainment outside.

PROBABLY STATES MASTERS SWIMMING IN HONG KONG

On 18th June 2023 HKFC swimming team put up another deadly performance at the Hong Kong **Long Course Masters Swimming** Competition at Sun Yat Sen Memorial Park Swimming Pool. The squad sent a record number of swimmers totaling some thirteen swimmers to compete in this meet. The expanded team by no means presented diluted and diminished qualities; rather it had such breadth and depth in qualities showcasing such a ferocious performance in a wide range of individual and relay events. The Hong Kong Master swim community now would find it difficult to argue against the notion that our team is probably the best Master Swimming Team in Hong Kong.

he newcomers to the team showed no timidity in their individual events. Farah Master was able to step up her tempo(s) in the 100m freestyle female 35-39 aged group coming in a very close second place. Farah is one of the most serious and intense swimmers in our training sessions that has so much potential to ascend "to the top of the perch" in the master arena. Our new joined Shane Davis who had his first "stab" at the ultra-competitive and brutal 100 m freestyle 35-39 male aged group event must now realize that he may need to attend more often and stay longer at our trainings to put his "powerful" swimming body machine to work. The team was so delighted to see our ever committed and improving **Heinrich** Grabner swam extremely well in his maiden master swim taking part in 100 m freestyle 45-49 male aged group. As a late entrant to the competitive swimming Heinrich brought with him his Mixed Martial Arts fighting spirits to our training and time trials. Against the backdrop of his marked and vast improvement the team is hoping that he will deliver that "knock out" performance in the upcoming "World Swimming Masters Championship" in August.

The backbone of the team continued to dominate their individual events. Our Captain Craig Nortje demolished all the competing swimmers in both his 50 m back and 100 m free male 45-49 aged group events clocking some ridiculous times of 30.9 s and 57.8 s respectively. With all due respects to all the swimmers Craig unapologetically made a complete mockery of the 50m back event by beating the second placed by a third of the racing distance. Our superstar **Alex Fong** having just finished his overnight TV shooting(s) set with his tired eyes barely opened dived into both 100m breaststroke and 400m free events in the male 40-44 age group. Alex is undisputedly a world class swimmer. His pedigree spoke a lot louder than his apparent sleepiness by powering to first in both events. Our Marcus Chu did very well in securing the well-deserved third place in his debutant 100 m free male 50-54 age group. A highly competitive versatile events swimmer Marcus was calibrating himself in preparation for the upcoming World Championships in Japan. Arthur Li again effortlessly came top in the 100 m free male 50-54 aged group under the time of one minute exposing a 10 second margin from the



second placed swimmer. We all look forward to the day when Arthur would be seriously challenged and unleash his full potential. Having secured his baby daughter's permission to spend a couple of hours at the meet **Anthony Lo** put out his best performance in the 400m free in his 30-34 age group. The team jokingly remarked that his podium third place would earn him a break from changing her nappies. Our Coach **Dominic Tsui** continued to shine in his both coaching and renditioning aquatic extravaganza by delivering a respectable fifth and third place in the 100 m freestyle and 400 m freestyle

in his 60-64 age group. Last "and" least the epilogue to the individual event narratives cannot be completed without mentioning the gritty and defiant performance by our perennial **Patrick Ip** in both 50m backstroke and 400 m freestyle in the 55-59 age group where he made a strong push in the second half of the race(s) as if he was possessed to achieve second place(s).

The real highlights of the day was the spectacular performance put out by our relay teams. Both mens relay teams (160-199 and 200-239 combined age groups) took first place in the 4X50m free relays in a near record breaking time. The surprise in these performances was in seeing our impressive "Flying Dutchman" Vasco Van Der Filer blowing everyone away. Vasco specialises in triathlon and is an extremely versatile and talented athlete. He has recently made his mark in the competitive endurance marathon running! Our mixed relay team (160-199 combined age group) came third in the 4X50m medley relays. It was very exciting to see Farah catching up in the last 50m and our new comer **Dr. Angie Fong** participating competitive swimming after 20 years of long absence.









The event took place on 25th June in two distances, 1.5k and 3.8k swims. S&T society participated in both events.

Special mention to Farah Master who set a new course record in her AG in the 3.8k distance! Congratulations!





FOOTBALL SEASON

The 2019-2020 Hong Kong football season was a forgettable one. Multiple matches were cancelled in the first half of the season due to social unrest. Then, the COVID-19 pandemic swept through Hong Kong and the rest of the world, causing more matches to be cancelled due to the need of social distancing. On 1st April 2020, men's professional football was only played in three out of 211 FIFA national associations - Belarus, Burundi and Nicaragua. Regrettably, the Hong Kong Football Association (HKFA) announced, on 16th April 2020, the cancellation of all remaining matches in all leagues except the Premier League. This marks only the second time that the 1st Division was truncated. The first time this happened was when the Japanese invasion interrupted the 1941-1942 season.

s the current football season is no more, let us take a look at the other '19 to '20 season — the one that happened a century ago. This season has some significance to the Hong Kong Football Club ('Club') which I will make clear later on.

A hundred years ago, the local football scene was different in a lot of ways. **The 1st Division** was the top-tier of a two-division amateur league system that was run separately from the Hongkong* Football Association. The division had six teams: Hongkong Football Club, Royal Navy, Hongkong Police, Royal Garrison Artillery (RGA), St. Joseph's College and South China Athletic Association. Of the six, three are still competing in the HKFA leagues today. The season was short: it started on 1st November and ended on 10th January with all but one match played on Saturdays. For the Club side, Navy was the main opponent to beat as it edged Club to win the 1918-1919 league championship by one point. South China came last in the league in 1918-1919, their debut season in the 1st Division, but were the runners-up to Club in the Challenge Shield. St. Joseph's were allowed to join the top-tier 1919-1920 after becoming 2nd Division champions in 1918-1919.

The pyramid (2-3-5) formation was the popular one of the day. Club's team had **George Sinclair Rodger** as the goalkeeper for all matches. In defence were **F. Black** and **John 'Jock' McCubbin** as full-backs. Usual half-backs (mid-fielders) included **J.W.R. McPhail, M.L. Railton** and **James Stewart**. In the front, captain **Hector Mac McTavish** and **D. Reichelmann** played

all matches, while John Rodger (George's elder brother), J.B. Hamilton, E. Riis and J. Stalker made frequent appearances. The side was reinforced by the 'three R's' Railton, Rodger and Ralston — who returned from war service, while the 'two R's' — **Reichelmann** and **Riis** — played good football during the previous season. It is interesting that full-back Black was 'thought to have retired' according to the report of the season-opening match. He ended up appearing in all but one match and was a major contributor to multiple victories. New additions halfway through this season included right winger J.B. Hamilton who played for Celtic Juniors, and full-back J. Tonkin who came from Shanghai and was the captain of **Shanghai Football Club** until December 1919. Eight of the regulars (Hamilton, MacTavish, McCubbin as captain, McPhail, the Rodger brothers, Stalker and Stewart) were Scotsmen who represented Scotland in the charity match in aid of the 'Devastated France' Fund on 27th December 1919. Only two (Black as captain and Railton) represented England.

The Club's 1919-1920 season opened with a re-match of the previous season's

Challenge Shield final. The match itself was strongly reminiscent of that final, and Club won by the same margin, 1:0 The forwards could never quite get clear away but won by a lucky goal against a dashing South China side. On the same day, Navy crushed St. Joseph's 7:0 and RGA overpowered Police 5:3. The second match showcased the strongest rivalry in the league in which Club drew with Navy 1:1. Black in defence was praised as having an 'extraordinarily fine display' while McTavish and Rodger were 'most conspicuous' in the front. The goal-scorer Reichelmann, however, 'did not show much initiative'. In Week 3, the opponent was the league-leading RGA which had a prolific scorer in Green. Despite not giving 'a convincing display' and the forwards missing easy chances by faulty shooting, Club dethroned RGA and moved into second place on the league table with the same number of points as Navy but an inferior goal average (number of goals scored divided by number of goals conceded — the tie-breaker during that era). In Week 4, Club easily handled a weaker Police team by winning 3:0, and 'would have doubled their score but for their erratic shooting'. With Navy and South China drawing unexpectedly, Club moved to the top of the league table.

Of special note was Club's Week 6 match against South China. According to the match report in The China Mail, remaining matches. The Hongkong Daily Press match report stated that Club's 'display was the best they have given this season', with attacks 'all

in the first half and inside left in the second half, scored both Club goals. With another win against RGA in Week 8, Club secured the 1st Division League championship before Christmas and two rounds early.

Club was undefeated in their championship season with nine wins and one draw for a total of 19 points. They scored 20 goals and conceded only two. Interestingly, only two of the wins were decided by a margin of more than two goals. Two teams scored more goals: Navy (26) and RGA (21) but the team which conceded the second-least goals (Navy) gave up 11. There was no surprise that terms like 'tower of strength' and 'brick wall' were used to describe Club full-backs Black and McCubbin. In the report of the final match of the season, Hongkong Daily Press went as far as stating 'the Club will not for many years find such an invaluable pair of backs as Black and McCubbin, who understand each other's play to the point of perfection' and 'the Club had the best forward line in the Colony, their combination reaching that degree of excellence which is not often seen in football in the Far East'. Reichelmann came third in total scoring (7 goals), behind Graydon (Navy) and Green (RGA). There was a bit of home advantage as all but the final match was played on home ground. This drew complaint in the form of a letter to the editor of The China Mail published on 12th December 1919.

As a postscript, McCubbin, Stewart and George Rodger were all involved in interport matches. McCubbin retired from playing football around 1925 but served as one of the joint managers of the 1926 Hong Kong team playing interport and friendly matches in Shanghai. He served as the chairman of the Hongkong Football Club (1922-1927) and president of the Hongkong Football Association (1924-1925) before leaving Hong Kong in 1928. Stewart represented the colony six times until 1926 and captained the team at least twice in interport matches against Shanghai. He left Hong Kong in the early 1930s. The Hong Kong-born George Rodger represented Hong Kong nine times between 1926 and 1936, and was regarded as the best goalkeeper of the era. He retired from playing football in 1937 and died at the age of 44 in the Stanley Civilian Internment Camp during the Japanese occupation.

The 1919-1920 championship marked the first and most recent time that Club came first in the local top-tier league. They had to wait 98 years before another 1st Division (as a second-tier league) championship which came in the 2017-2018 season. I look forward to the day that the honour of winning the top-tier league can be repeated.

The referee, standing near the goal, ruled that it was a goal which sealed yet another 1:0 Club victory against South China. A re-match between Club and Navy in Week 7 was much anticipated as the only hope of the second-placed Navy to win the league was to (1) defeat Club, (2) win all remaining matches AND (3) have Club losing at least two of their


