

he "Product Eco-responsibility (Amendment) Bill 2023" has officially come into effect in April. This legislation regulates the use of disposable plastic tableware and other plastic products, aiming to reduce waste and promote environmental sustainability. Our Club has wholeheartedly embraced this initiative, ensuring full compliance with the government's policy. Together, we can make a significant impact in reducing plastic waste and preserving our planet for future generations.

ADHERING TO THE NEW REGULATIONS

Effective immediately, the Club will no longer distribute for free a range of disposable plastic products in our F&B outlets and changing rooms.

Please refer to https://rb.gy/trltt0 for the government announcement on the regulation and the list of affected items.

WASTE AND RECYCLE MANAGEMENT INITIATIVES

In addition to complying with the government's regulations, the Club has taken proactive steps to enhance waste and recycle management. The Club now facilitates the collection of various items, ensuring they are properly handled. These include food waste, used cooking oil, glass bottles, plastic bottles, tins and metals, cardboard paper, electronic devices, old tools, and old uniforms and linens. All waste is diligently sorted and collected in designated areas.

ANTICIPATING THE MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTE CHARGING SCHEME

We eagerly await further announcements from the government regarding the implementation of the Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) charging scheme, which is anticipated to commence on 1st August.

In preparation for this scheme, the Club has devised a comprehensive plan to further enhance waste management practices. Under the MSW charging scheme, waste will be sorted in the back of the house, with different materials collected by specialised handlers. This approach eliminates the need for extra bins and bags, and will facilitate efficient waste sorting. By implementing sorting and crushing methods, the Club aims to reduce all kinds of waste, resulting in more desirable result.

The 25th Anniversary of our world-famous HKFC Sevens Tournament kicks off at the end of May, and this year, we are planning the biggest event yet. Between 24th and the 26th of May, we anticipating around eight thousand people through the 'turnstiles'. Last year's event got a late go-ahead to proceed with the mask mandate and travel restrictions being relaxed just in time to go forward, which meant that planning was challenging. Despite these challenges, the team pulled off a fantastic tournament. look in the opposite direction from day one. "A lot of us were invited to tournaments in Singapore, Thailand and Malaysia as seven-a-side competitions had already been created by clubs such as Singapore Cricket Club," recalls Bratsanos. "We played in those tournaments against some of the great old stars like Alan Kennedy, Mario **Kempes** and **Didier Six**. I was chairman of the Soccer Section, and at our AGM. I said we could stage our own tournament because our facilities are excellent, probably better than many others. The then chairman, Alistair McCleod, endorsed it, so off we went. It was very much focused on the

Masters in those days, but our big trick was going for the youth, so we started inviting the academies over."

According to Bratsanos, Blackburn Rovers and Celtic were the big-name draws at the inaugural event in 1999. And it was the 1994-95 English Premier League champions who would be the first winners after they defeated the Glasgow side in the final.

The following year local side Instant Dict overcame Chelsea in the final as they became the first winners from Hong Kong, although English teams would establish a dominance in the ensuing years.

Arsenal were crowned champions in 2001 after ending Instant Dict's bid for back-to-back titles, before the Gunners were defeated by Aston Villa in the final a year later as the Midlands side began their love affair with the tournament. This year, the now seven-time champions Aston Villa return to Hong Kong to defend their 2023 title, for the silver anniversary of the tournament.

The HKFC Standard Chartered Soccer Sevens is a labour of love for the people who work tirelessly plan and execute it. We are looking forward to another hugely successful event and hope to see you all there.

immediate after the uneventful Chinese Lunar year shenanigans in Hong Kong, our ex-Hong Kong Champion and Olympian and Hong Kong record holder **Alex Fong** whipped up Hong Kong pride with a loud bang in the World Master Swimming Competition in the afar Doha, Qatar. In the last World Master meet in Japan HKFC sent out a colossal team of eight swimmers. Whilst the entire Hong Kong swimming team have decided to relegate competitive swimming to a subordinated role in their busy domestic life for this meet. our Alex once again showed his mettle and leadership by stepping to the fore and being the only swimmer representing HKFC in this world meet.

Prior to his departure the team already had a prescient sense that Alex would made a significant impact in this world swimming meet. The teams' optimism was more than justified by Alex's outstanding solo performance in his five individual events. He had an auspicious start by clocking 2m 19s in the 200m backstroke and clenching the silver medal in his first event. This was

followed by the very competitive 100m backstroke in which he earned a narrow 4th place. Alex then broke the Hong Kong master record and was placed third in the 200m Individual Medley coming in 2m 17s. He then managed to secure a 4th place under 5m 04s in the most gruelling pool swimming event being the 400m Individual Medley. Put his extraordinary race time into perspective -that would take a normal person the same time being less than 5 minutes and 4 seconds to stroll up and down a standard 50m swimming pool eight times!! Despite the mental and physical exhaustion. Alex in his typical good sportsmanship fashion gave it all in his last event being 200m butterfly touching the wall in 2m 27s.

Hong Kong swimming prodigy son's performance was both inspiring and tantalising and has fully vindicated why he is considered as one of the best, if not the best, competitive swimmers for his generation in Hong Kong.

Alex demonstrated that determination, consistency and positivity is a sine qua

non for success whether in swimming or otherwise. His exemplary attitude has invigorated the team to step up and train harder for the next World Master Swimming Championship in Singapore next year.

Swimming arguably is one of the most competitive and demanding sports. However, master swimming somehow is underrated and does not receive the attention that it deserves in Hong Kong in a stark contrast with our Japanese and Korean counterparts. In the past two World Master Swimming Championships swimmers HKFC master swimmers put up some extraordinary performances winning a number of Gold. Silver and Bronze medals and coming within the top five positions in these highly competitive world events. These are no fortuitous achievements; our swimmers have put in many gruelling hours into training starting at 6:30am dawn.






