

A WORLD-CLASS LINE-UP OF TEAMS

This year's tournament featured 12 men's and 8 women's teams competing across three men's pools and two women's pools. The quality and diversity of the teams underscored the event's international appeal and competitive edge.

Men's Pools:

Pool A: Shogun RFC, Ashbury Tropics, Shandong Rugby Club, SHRM Overseas Old Boys

Pool B: UBB 10s (Union Bordeaux Bègles), Pig Athletic Club BaaBaas, Preseli Babas, Valley Broncos

Pool C: Tradition YCAC, HKFC Natixis Club, Taikoo Place Scottish Exiles, Shenzhen Pirates

Women's Pools:

Pool A: RKS New Zealand Legends, Nagato Blue Angels, Shandong Rugby Club, Valley Broncos

Pool B: HKFC Natixis Ice, Shogun Rebels, Beijing Rugby, Haywards Tropics

Despite the late withdrawal of the Mourant Samoa men's team, replaced by Shenzhen Pirates, the tournament maintained a high level of competition and excitement.

RUGBY LEGENDS AND RISING STARS

The tournament attracted rugby luminaries such as former New Zealand Sevens captain **Scott Curry** who took on a coaching role with Shogun Men's team, and four-time Women's Rugby

World Cup winner **Anna Richards**, coaching the RKS New Zealand Legends Women's team. Their involvement brought invaluable experience and inspiration to players and fans alike.

The HKFC 10s continues to be a breeding ground for future international stars. In 2024, 28 players who competed in the 10s went on to represent their countries at the Paris Olympics and HSBC SVNS, highlighting the tournament's role in developing elite rugby talent.

FINALS AND RESULTS

The culmination of two days of intense rugby saw thrilling finals across the Men's and Women's Cup, Plate and Bowl competitions:

Men's Cup Final: Tradition YCAC edged out Pig Athletic Club BaaBaas 19-14 in a thrilling overtime finish, sealed by a last-minute try.

Women's Cup Final: RKS New Zealand Legends secured a hard-fought 5-0 victory over Nagato Blue Angels, showcasing disciplined defence and tactical play under coach Anna Richards.

Men's Plate Final: Ashbury Tropics defeated HKFC Natixis Club 24-10.

Women's Plate Final: Shandong Rugby Club overcame HKFC Natixis Ice 17-7.

Men's Bowl Final: Shandong Rugby Club won against Valley Broncos 28-12.

Women's Bowl Final: Shogun Rebels defeated Beijing Rugby 5-0.

A FESTIVE ATMOSPHERE AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Adding to the excitement off the pitch was the highly anticipated "Unfiltered: An Evening with Jim Hamilton, Andy Goode, and The KOKO Show" event held on 25th March at the Happy Valley Suites. Featuring rugby legends from both hemispheres, including former Wallabies stars Matt Giteau, Drew Mitchell and Adam Ashley-Cooper alongside Scotland's Jim Hamilton and England's Andy Goode, the event offered fans unique insights and engaging conversations ahead of the tournament.

The tournament atmosphere was energised by the return of the Orion Beer Village in the Training Triangle, which quickly became a favourite gathering spot for fans and players alike. Orion's role as official beer sponsor added a lively and social dimension to the 2-day event.

Entertainment highlights during the tournament included a great show by Seiileafi whose performances brought energy and excitement to the vibrant atmosphere, further enhancing the fan experience.

GIVING BACK THROUGH RUGBY

This year, the Tradition HKFC 10s proudly introduced the **10x10s initiative** in partnership with the **HKFC Rugby Centurions**, a series of community-focused activities designed to raise awareness and support for important causes. Throughout the lead-up to and during the tournament, the initiative engaged players, members and fans in meaningful ways, including collaborations with local charities and community groups.

The culmination of these efforts was the highly anticipated **Legends Charity Touch Match** held on the Wednesday of the tournament, featuring rugby legends and club players. This special event supported **Mind The Waves**, a Hong Kong-based charity focused on mental health through a partnership with **Laureus Sport for Good** which uses sport as a tool to empower young people. The 10x10s initiative reflects the Club's commitment to giving back and using rugby as a force for positive community impact.

As we celebrate the achievements of 2025, we eagerly anticipate the 40th anniversary of the HKFC 10s next year. This milestone will honour four decades of rugby excellence, camaraderie and community spirit at the Hong Kong Football Club.





he 2024-25 season proved to be another strong showing for HKFC's rugby teams, with multiple championship victories across different divisions:

HKFC Natixis Club maintained their dominance in the Men's Premiership, securing their seventh consecutive league title with an impressive record of 14 wins and 1 loss. However, they fell short in the Grand Championship final, losing 40-29 to HKU Sandy Bay RFC. There's plenty to be proud of throughout the season though – with Club's ability to score some brilliant tries, a hallmark of Head Coach Logan Asplin's; in Club's 17 matches, they scored an average of 41 points!

In the Women's Premiership, HKFC
Natixis Ice, under new Head Coach
Hannah Edwards, finished second
behind Societe Generale Valley RFC.
They reached their third straight Grand
Championship final but narrowly lost
7-3 to Valley, ending the season with
12 wins and 5 losses. It shouldn't be
estimated how much the women's elite
programme at HKFC has gone from
strength to strength – it was only 3
seasons ago where HKFC Natixis Ice
had finished in 5th out of 6.

HKFC Natixis Dragons claimed the HKCR Premiership A League title – having a remarkable run after Christmas to snatch the trophy off Shenzhen Pirates. It wasn't meant to be in the final though as they later lost to the same opponents 44-28. That saw the Drags finish with 10 wins and 4 losses.

HKFC Natixis Fire showed impressive growth in the Women's Championship League, qualifying for the top bracket and reaching the semi-finals before falling to eventual champions Societe Generale Valley Red 10-5. They managed to pull off plenty of upsets along the way, including beating USRC Tigers Ladies 2 by 31-15 in February 2025.











HKFC Natixis Scorpions emerged victorious in both the HKCR Championship League 1 and Grand Championship, overcoming early-season injuries. Their final against University Typhoons was one for the history books decided by Fraser Leishman's clever chip-and-chase try in the closing minutes for a 10-3 win.

While **HKFC Natixis Select** faced another challenging season in HKCR Championship League 1, finishing sixth, HKFC Natixis Bulls dominated Championship League 2, winning both the league and Grand Championship titles as the Club's only undefeated team this season. Their 47-19 final victory over RB-SRK Tin Shui Wai Pandas showcased their trademark forward superiority, with the likes of man mountains Sias Potgieter & Gav Boak scoring tries for fun.

HKFC Natixis Sequins, coming off the double achieved in the 2023-24 season in Championship League 3, made an impressive transition to Championship League 2. They adapted well to the higher level of competition, pushing many of the teams close, securing a commendable fourth-place finish and reaching the Grand Championship semi-finals.

Our newly re-introduced team **HKFC Natixis Expendables** completed a remarkable turnaround season in Community League 1, finishing second in the league and clinching the Grand Championship. Their journey from an opening day 0-58 loss to Sandy Bay to defeating the same team 24-17 in the Grand Championship final exemplified their growth in their first season back competing. With 13 wins from 17 games and scoring a whopping 116 tries throughout the season, they finally secured their first trophy in over a decade.

SUNDAY, 30TH MARCH 2025

Capping off a wonderful season of both 15s and 7s, our U16 Girls Premiership team, comprising Jem, Louanne, Maya, Philo, Kez, Zoe, Lea, Mia, Louise, Chiara, Romane and Sabrina, played Sandy Bay in the 7s showcase Premiership Final at Kai Tak Stadium, bright and early on Sunday 30th March.

It was a genuine thrill for the girls to have the opportunity to play on the big stage at the brand new Kai Tak Stadium and to run out onto the hallowed turf as their heroes had been doing all weekend.

Going into the final, we were coming off the back of a defeat to Sandy Bay a couple of weeks previously, and the girls were determined to put in a better performance in the final. We started well from the very first kick-off, putting considerable pressure on Sandy Bay and largely pinning them in their own half. This pressure was turned into points when **Lea** recognised the opportunity to take a quick tap penalty from 7 metres out and muscled her way over to score.

Lea then expertly converted her own try from the 15m line to give us an all important 7-point lead. A second try was shortly

forthcoming as **Chiara** spotted a semi gap in the defence and, as she has done many times this season, ghosted through to score under the posts. **Lea** did the honours with the conversion to make it 14-0 at halftime.

In the second half, the girls maintained their intensity in defence, and kept the ball well to create space for **Louise** to break through and score from 30 metres out. An excellent team try then followed with seconds remaining, seeing **Maya** accelerate away from the Sandy Bay defence to score in the corner, bringing the final score to 24-0.

This was a fantastic end to a highly enjoyable and successful 7s season. The girls deserve tremendous credit for their attitude, effort and character throughout, and it is a joy to watch them continue to develop as a team.
