FINANCE - Mervyn Jacob

FUNCTION: to carefully consider the financial implications of proposals and policies brought forth by the GC, and to provide advice, and, if deemed appropriate, make recommendations to the GC for final approval.

CONSTITUTIONAL AFFAIRS AND DISCIPLINE - Damien Laracy

FUNCTION: to review of the Club's Articles of Association, Bye-laws and Policy Statements to keep them relevant and useful. Monitor and review the constitutions/Bye-Laws of all Club bodies for consistency. Standardise signage, notices, forms and provide advice on constitutional aspects are additional responsibilities. Finally, to take action on misconduct complaints to ensure compliance with the Bye-laws for the enjoyment of all Members.

DEVELOPMENT - Kenneth Ng

FUNCTION: to identify and evaluate suitable

development initiatives for the Club's facilities in the short, medium, and long term, and to recommend selected proposals to GC for consideration and subsequent implementation.

MEMBERSHIP - Don Rider

FUNCTION: to oversee the admission of new Members, to monitor existing policies and to advise on membership-related matters, including procedures (including Sections) and compliance with these policies.

SPORTS AND RECREATION - John Thompson

FUNCTION: to promote and support the development of recognised sporting activities and competitive recreational activities for members, also collaborate with management to maximise the utilisation of the Club's sports facilities.

MAJOR EVENTS - Mia Williams

FUNCTION: to work with the event organising committees, provide assistance and support to ensure a coordinated and consistent approach to sponsorship contracts and event administration, and provide timely reports on major events to the General Committee.

THE THOUGHTS OF THE CHAIRMAN

As this is the start of a new year, it is timely for me to share with you an important update that affects us all. Our **Bye-laws** embody who we are as members, our behaviour and interaction with each other and how we take care of our Club. In the middle of last year, led by then Deputy General Manager **Randal Linhart**, the Management team carried out a workshop on the current Bye-laws. It's worth mentioning that the Bye-laws had not been reviewed or updated in quite some time. The exercise presented us with some insight and an opportunity to make a few updates and modifications. The biggest change was in the way the Bye-laws were written. Preambles and lengthy paragraphs have been replaced with direct, to the point sentences, but without losing the importance to what was being expressed. There were areas that needed adjustment to the times, while others a slight relaxation, without losing our values and pedigree associated with the Club's proud 137-year history.

To get to this point, Management sought the counsel of the General Committee's Constitutional Affairs Officer, **Jeff Lane**, who took on the task and convened several Constitutional Affairs Sub-committee (CASC) meetings to completely redraft the Bye-laws, with focus on topics such as Dress Code, Use of Electronic Devices, Children, Membership, Secondary Carers and much, much more. Vice President **Bobby Lawson** took the lead on much of the redrafting and devoted hours of his time in doing so. After lengthy and careful consideration, CASC were ready to put the amended Bye-laws forward to **General Committee** members, which was followed by another round of considered deliberation. The result of all this hard work is the production of updated Bye-laws that have satisfied both CASC and the General Committee. Updated Bye-laws have been uploaded to the Club's website on 1st January 2024.

Although introduced to you back in December, this month's magazine features an introduction to this year's **General Committee members**, on the adjacent page. Please look for them in the Club and show your support to HKFC.

I take this opportunity to wish you, your family, and friends all the very best in the year to come. Let's make it a great 2024 at the Club.

為此,管理層尋求時任常務委員會政制事務委員上解析。 員Jeff Lane的協助,召開了多次政制事務小組委員會(CASC)會議,重新起草附例,將焦點放在衣著準則、電子器材的使用、兒童、會籍、次要照顧者及其他更多的主題上。副會長Bobby Lawson亦帶頭起草大部分附例,更投入了以小時計的私人時間於此工作上。經長時間的審慎考慮後,CASC向常務委員會成員提出已修改的附例,緊隨其後是再一次深思熟慮的審議,在以上各方的重重努力下,最終制定出令CASC及常務委員會都滿意的更新附例。附例已於2024年1月1日上傳到本會網站。

藉此機會,祝大家與身邊的家人及朋友新一年 事事順利。一起在本會打造美好的2024年。



However, that wasn't the only news, the relay team managed to break the world record for the oldest team to compete and finish a Hyrox competition with a combined age of "244 years of age". 
TO CONDUCT A SATISFACTION SURVEY OF THE CLUB'S MEMBERS IN SEPTEMBER 2023.






Positive Club image and good service quality are areas that satisfy members' expectations.

For sports facilities, specialized sports facilities like


RUGBY, SOCCER PITCH AND SQUASH CENTRE

are the most satisfying among all sports facilities. The condition of sports facilities is considered well-maintained, and the coaching services are positively evaluated by the members. On the other hand, some facilities are commented to be difficult to book.



For recreation facilities, the satisfaction level with them has improved compared with the previous year. The horse racing box and Swimming Pool Complex are the most satisfactory facilities. The recreation facilities are considered well-maintained and clean except for the Children's Playrooms.

Staff are perceived to be helpful. However, some facilities were closed during the pandemic which caused inconvenience and disappointment.




For food and beverage outlets, the satisfaction level with the food in them has slightly improved compared with the survey completed in 2021.







is the only local top league team that signed up

to participate in the Gay Games. They organised two teams to participate in the event and both successfully advanced to the quarter-finals of the cup. The main members are composed of the women's first team, and the team members come from various teams of the Hong Kong Association. As well as friendship, for example, former Hong Kong Club striker Robert Scott, who currently plays for Division One Wing Yi, also made a guest appearance for HKFC on the first day of the game, and the women's team coach also played for the team.

In addition, the conference also invited the HKFC Crusaders team to play an exhibition match. HKFC Crusaders is a team of players with special needs. HKFC provides them with basic football training and hopes that the players will gain confidence through football activities.

IMPORTANT GAMES

"This tournament is open to all genders. We are aware that some teams may be very physical, so we try to balance the teams. Both teams have male and female players." HKFC vice-captain Gina Benjamin is one of the promoters of this participation. She believes that the Gay Games means a lot to herself and other people in the team.

"This competition is very important to us. There are members on the team who are members of the LGBTQ+

community, so everyone is very happy to have the opportunity to show support for the community. When I said in the club that I wanted to form a team to compete, everyone is very supportive and excited, and celebrating the entire LGBTQ+ community. We are attending the Gay Games during the day this weekend and also have a league match against Grace Citizens in the evening. Since other teams also have games on the weekend, this may This is what makes it difficult for other teams to participate in the Gay Games."

The Gay Games received criticism from many conservatives before it was unveiled, and the scale was smaller than originally planned.

"It was affected by the epidemic, and this competition did not receive much government support, so other projects could not be held in good public venues. It's a shame, but no matter how difficult the situation is. the game must go on."

"No matter what the evaluation of the Gay Games is, the public has different discussions. Many people did not know that the Gay Games is held in Hong Kong. There are many questions, what are Gay Games? What are LGBTQ+? This is a good platform for





us to compete together, everyone can participate, regardless of their gender, identity, ability, we are open to everyone."

Gina started participating in football training at the age of 15 and once played for Sheffield United.

She came to Hong Kong 7 years ago and has been working in the education industry ever since. In August this year, she married **Beck**, who was from Australia and met in Hong Kong, at the British Embassy in Vietnam.

In terms of her football career, when **Gina** first came to Hong Kong, she contacted the Eastern District Women's Team online and later switched to Kitchee. She has played for the Hong Kong Football Club for the past three years and is currently the team's vice-captain.

"I am a full-time worker, and it is difficult to meet the requirements of a semiprofessional team. I am married and have my own social life. For me, I still enjoy football, but life balance is very important to me."

FOOTBALL UNDER THE RAINBOW

Having competed in women's football tournaments all over the world for many years, **Gina** admitted that she is very lucky because she has never been prejudiced or discriminated against due to her sexual orientation during her football career.

"The craze of the Women's World Cup has been helpful in promoting women's football. Starting last season, some football teams in Hong Kong The semi-professionalization of the team is a good starting point, but overall football is still a male-dominated sport. The LGBTQ+ culture of men's football and women's football is very different."

"You rarely hear of male players coming out, anywhere, at any level, but in the world of women's football, there are so many professional players who have come out. I imagine in the world of men's football, the prejudice and discrimination It's still very serious. If a male player comes out, he will receive a lot of criticism or even bullying, which will have a very negative impact on him. But in the women's team, this will not be a problem at all."

The HKFC has long competed in the Women's League One. As one of the team captains, **Gina** will wear a rainbow armband when playing. This tradition has continued since **Gina** played for the team, and may have started earlier.

"Rainbow armbands are a global movement, and captains of many teams will wear rainbow armbands. Today's football is a sport that everyone can participate in. Many different people participate in football, so this is to show their support for them. Support. I wear a rainbow armband and I am a gay, and the last captain was Straight. The HKFC captain has been wearing rainbow armbands for many seasons. This is something that the members of the HKFC Women's Team support."






SAINTS VISIT TO HKFC




Additionally, RBSC also brought a special gift for HKFC as a gesture of goodwill.

n 4th November, five teams of passionate swimmers, including Hong Kong Football Club's very own members: Farah Master, Vasco van der Flier, and Shane Davis, came together to complete the inaugural 'Make Waves for Hong Kong', a 45km multi-relay swim around Hong Kong Island. The swim relay successfully raised over HK\$3 million for Splash Foundation, a charity dedicated to addressing chronic swim illiteracy in the city by providing free learn-to-swim programs to underprivileged individuals, including low-income families, children with special educational needs, and domestic workers.

The first relay swimmers, from each team, which were labeled by colours: Blue, Red, Green, Purple and Orange, started at 3:15am in the dark from Sandy Bay near Cyberport. **Davis** started the relay off for Team Green, plunging into the dark waters, to be relieved 30 minutes later by the next relay swimmer stepping in outside Kennedy Town, and then progressing clockwise through Victoria Harbour as the sun came up, to Chai Wan, Shek O, around Cape D'Aguilar and on to Stanley, Ap Lei Chau, and finishing around 10 to 11 hours later at Sandy Bay.

The swim event followed Marathon



Swimming Federation rules, the swimmers wore one standard issue swim costume and a pair of goggles, and they were not permitted to touch any of the support vessels around them or receive assistance in any way.

Despite some challenging conditions, the inaugural swim event proceeded smoothly. Swimmers navigated Victoria Harbour in the dark, reaching Chai Wan at sunrise. The stretch from Big Wave Bay to Cape D'Aguilar was the most picturesque, but also the choppiest section of the journey. Swimmers ventured through the Lamma Channel to complete the 45km circumnavigation.

The first team to reach the finish line was Team Purple, which included both Farah and Vasco, in 10 hours 14 minutes

and 55 seconds. Shortly thereafter, the other four teams finished the swim. The swimmers were greeted by celebration and enthusiastic supporters and beneficiaries of Splash Foundation.






